History of Millard:

Millard was platted in 1870 by Canadian Ezra Millard. Ezra Millard and his family originally moved to Iowa from Canada. Ezra and his brother Joseph then moved to Omaha in 1856, and they established the land office of Barrows, Millard and Company. Situated twelve miles from Omaha, Millard was officially incorporated a town on September 26, 1885. A post office was established in Millard in 1873, and remained in operation until it was discontinued in 1967. In 1971 Millard was officially annexed by city of Omaha and is a suburban area located in the southwest section of the city.
